

#### VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES

#### June 10th, 2024 - Regular Meeting

- Councillors Perriere and Van Bynen were authorized to attend the 2024 UBCM Convention in Vancouver, BC, on September 16th-20th alongside Mayor Lunn as voting delegates representing the Village of Slocan. Staff were directed to complete conference registration and hotel booking.
- Council awarded \$1,200 from the RDCK Community Development Grant Fund to the New Denver Pavillion's Wheelchair Accessible Garden Bed Project, and \$500 from the RDCK Discretionary Grant Fund to the WE Graham
- The "Block 34 Lane Closure and Highway Dedication Removal Bylaw" was adopted, and the "Slocan Zoning Amendment Bylaw" was given third reading. Adoption of the Zoning Amendment will be considered at a special meeting on June 24.
- Council approve the Development Variance Permit application to vary the off-street parking and building setback requirements, as established in the Village of Slocan Zoning Bylaw, for the property legally described as Lots 1-4 and 17-20, Block 34, Plan 496, DL 292, for the purpose of constructing the Slocan Affordable Housing Development, as follows:
  - To allow seven (7) of the fifteen (15) required parking stalls to be located off-site, on the north side of the Fitz Avenue road allowance: and
  - To permit a decrease in setback requirements on the front lot line (Hume Street) by a maximum of 14.5 feet, and 13.75 feet on the exterior lot line (Fitz Avenue), to accommodate eight (8) covered carports on

#### June 24th, 2024 - Special Meeting

The 2023 Annual Report was approved as presented, and the "Slocan Zoning Amendment Bylaw" was adopted.

#### July 8th, 2024 - Regular Meeting

- Council awarded \$75 from the RDCK Discretionary Grant Fund to the Kootenay Yoga Festival.
- Council awarded \$2,500 from the RDCK Community Development Grant Fund to the Slocan Library furniture upgrade project.
- Council will send a letter in support of Central Kootenay Community Future's Expression of Interest, to deliver the Rural Community Immigration Pilot Program in the West Kootenays.

#### **RDCK TRANSFER STATION NOTICE:**

Please be advised that the RDCK is intending on completing a major construction project at the Slocan Transfer Station starting in the fall (October), and completing in December. This work will replace aging infrastructure, increase site capacity, and improve efficiency, including reconstruction of the bin wall and installing a staff washroom. The site will be temporarily closed during construction. The RDCK will accommodate service disruptions through increased hours of operation and staffing at the closest neighbouring facility for both waste and recycling. More info will be posted out as available, stay tuned!




