

VILLAGE OF SLOCAN MEETING NOTES

October 15th, 2024 - Regular Meeting

- Mo Haroun, Executive Director, Laneway House Foundation, was in attendance to present information on the Slocan Village Affordable Housing Partnership followed by a discussion and question period.
- Council agreed to pool the funding received from the Ministry of Emergency Management and Climate with the Regional District of Central Kootenay in order that the RDCK coordinate with the Village the First Nations Engagement Process.
- Payment of \$100,000 to Municipal Finance Authority was authorized to pay down the Mill site loan. Staff will prepare an amendment to the financial plan of the Village of Slocan.
- Council awarded \$1700 from the RDCK Community Development fund, to the Chanterelles Slocan Valley Youth Choir.
- Approval granted for cutting a tree to place at the Wellness Centre for the 11th Annual Christmas Tree Light-Up. Public Works will assist with labour & equipment and the Wellness Centre will provide power, washrooms and hallway space during the celebration.
- Council approved use of the Expo Park to host a "Winter Carnival" in February 2025 pending submission of a completed Special Events Application and proof of insurance; and permission was granted for use of the stage & power.
